Contents of the module (brokedown into forms of classes)	In the first part of the course the theoretical background (the cultural perspective of postcolonial studies) and the explanation of the crucial terms will be presented, referring to selected studies carried out in the field of sociology of culture, cultural studies, and cultural anthropology. In the second part a few case studies will be analyzed taken into consideration examples of postcolonial cultural relations between European societies (mainly of Italy, Spain, Portugal) and their former colonies. Each case will be described according to a general scheme including: synthetic history of the colonial domination and the process of gaining independence; main actors and mains challenges of the current relations between the former colonizers and former colonies; examples of postcolonial interdependencies in the socio-cultural area. The postcolonial challenges will be analysed in the relation to the following themes: modern

migration processes; artistic creativity (literature, film, performance, visual arts, and others); construction/reinforcement of identity, social/journalistic activism, education.

In the third part of the course, students will be asked to prepare and present their own project (individually or in small teams) concerning postcolonialism and art in a selected cross-cultural setting. The students' participation will contribute to broaden and complete the general knowledge about the postcolonial processes and challenges, bringing a more interactive dimension to the course.
